ACTION	STANDARD	✓/x
Assess Danger	Visual search	
Assess Response	Question, command, shake	
Shout for help	Try to summon assistance	
Open and check airway	Tilt head back. Lift chin with 2 fingers	
Check breathing (present)	Look, listen, feel (10 seconds). Maintain airway throughout.	
Check Life Threatening Injuries	Signs of severe bleeding	
Place in Recovery Position	Lateral position Head position allows drainage of fluids Stable position Chest position maximizes respiratory effort Observation and access to the airway. There should be no risk of injury	
Go for Help	Correct information provided
